Special Note for Arts & Science Students:

(N) Course is offered outside of the College of Arts & Science. This non-A&S course may be used to fulfill an Arts & Science BREADTH OF STUDY requirement. It MAY NOT be used to fulfill an Arts & Science DEPTH OF STUDY requirement. Only ONE NON-A&S course may be used in each of the Breadth of Study areas. The entire list of courses for General Education Distribution does not note courses outside of the College of Arts & Science.
