At the State Historical Society of Missouri, which is located on campus, you can pursue an internship in archives and manuscripts, oral history, preservation/conservation, or curatorial/public programming. The <u>Kinder Institute</u> offers unique opportunities to network with historians, conduct research, publish journal articles, complete internships in Washington, D.C., or you could study abroad at places such as Oxford University.

Scholarships
